Over 18s are supported by Wokingham Borough Council's Adult Social Care.

At Pre-school and School

How do I get help for my child at school/nursery? What is an EHCP and why might my child need one?

The first step to getting extra support is to talk to your child's nursery or class teacher, or someone you trust at school who can liaise with the school's **Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCo)**. If your child is not at nursery yet and you feel they will need substantial support to attend nursery, please contact **Wokingham Borough Council Special Educational Needs & Disability (SEND) Service** to discuss.

Most children or young people with SEND will have their needs met within local mainstream Early Years settings or schools but a small number may require an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). If a child or young person needs support beyond what is Ordinarily Available in a mainstream school or Early Years setting, please speak to your school about how your children's needs could be met and the option of an EHCP needs assessment.

What is Ordinarily Available in early years and school settings is described in the **Ordinarily Available** document and is available on the WBC website. It sets out what is expected in Wokingham Early Years settings, schools, and colleges for children with SEND aged 0 to 25 years.

When your child needs more help above what is provided by the Ordinarily Available/SEN Support, an **Education Health & Care Plan (EHCP)** can be applied for. Wokingham Borough Council **SEND Service** undertakes the Education Health and Care (EHC) needs assessment for children and young people between the ages of 0 - 25 years. It arranges the provision required to meet the needs identified on an EHC plan and is involved in organising the appropriate annual reviews of a child's progress.

How do I get help for my child at home? (Equipment, behaviour, sleep, toileting etc)

For specialist equipment related to posture or safer manual handling, and for advice and support with specific adaptations at home contact Wokingham Borough Council's **Children with Disabilities (CWD)Team** who will assess for eligibility, and if eligible, refer your child to Wokingham Borough Council Children with Disability Team's Occupational Therapy (OT) service for specialist assessment.

Role of Professionals

I don't understand the different roles and responsibilities of those who are working with my child – can you explain?

It's not surprising if you're confused about the roles of the different people you meet. There can be a lot to take in, so don't be afraid to ask them. Your nursery, school, college and health professional such as GP or Health Visitor should also be able to help.

You can take a friend or family member to appointments with you to support you and help you remember what you want to ask and what is said. A list of some of the professionals you may come across is listed in the **Glossary** at the end of this guide.

This may result in getting services or direct payments to support your caring role. Glossary

Some of the key
SEND terms:

CAMHS	Child & Adolescent Mental Health Service
CYPIT	Children and Young People's Integrated Therapies which includes Occupational Therapy (OT) , Physiotherapy and Speech & Language Therapy (SALT) .
Disability Living Allowance (DLA)	To help with the extra costs you have if you have a disabled child or a child with a health condition.
Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)	A plan that describes the Special Educational Needs that a child/young person has and the help that they will be given to meet them. It also includes the health and care provision that is needed. It is a legal document written by the Local Authority and is used for children and young people who have high support needs.
EHCP Annual Review	Local Authorities must carry out a review of every EHC plan at least once every 12 months.
EP	Educational Psychologist
FSM	Free School Meals
Graduated Response	The SEND Code of Practice says that schools should follow a graduated approach when providing SEN Support. This is based on a cycle of: Assess > Plan > Do > Review. Also known as Ordinarily Available .

Glossary continued

Local Offer (LO)	Published by every Local Authority, tells you what support is available for children and young people with SEND and their families. It includes information about education, health, and care provision, training, employment, and independent living.
Ordinarily Available	Provision that is available to all children and young people with SEND, within early education settings, schools, academies, free schools and colleges as above.
Preparing for Adulthood (PfA)	Starts at age 14 years and is about the steps to support the young person to become as independent as possible and lead a full life.
SEND	Special Educational Needs & Disability
SENDIASS	Special Educational Needs and Disability Information, Advice & Support Service. A free, confidential, and impartial service that supports children & young people with SEND, and their parents.
SEN Support	SEN support includes any help for children & young people with SEN that is additional to or different from the support generally made for other children of the same age.

What do we do?

We give a voice to families who have a child or young person aged 0-25 years with any Special Educational Need or Disability (SEND).
