Providing holistic support to children & adults with sight loss, helping to boost self-esteem with emotional support, social clubs, home visits & sport.

Children, Young People and Families – benefit from the support we provide, getting involved in activities adapted to meet each young person's needs and having the opportunities to develop friendships with other visually impaired young people. Our activities are run throughout the year, but particularly in the school holidays to offer families the opportunities for quality family time together or for respite or to meet up and enjoy some time with others in similar situations. Previous activities have included cooking, craft, tennis, footgolf, visits to Legoland and London Zoo. Future events planned include Blind football sessions, taster sports days, going to a local pantomime, indoor climbing centre lesson, trampolining and swimming.

18-35's Social Group - meet on a regular basis to spend quality time together and take part in activities of their choosing. The aim of this group is to bring together visually impaired young adults, to encourage their independence and build confidence, to support their transition into adulthood. Previous activities have included skiing, pub lunches and visits to theme parks.

Membership of Berkshire Vision is free in 2021.

Camp Mohawk is a day centre for children with special needs and their families, set in 5 acres of beautiful countryside, just outside Wargrave, Berkshire. Throughout the year the centre provides a range of activities, facilities and natural space to encourage children with a variety of special needs to play, socialise and learn in a secure and caring environment. Our facilities include adventure playgrounds, swings, sensory garden, play village, soft play and sensory rooms, art / craft room, music room, play lounge and, in the summer months, an outdoor, heated play pool. All this is set in approximately 5 acres of natural woodland.

What we offer:

Family Days in school holidays and occasionally at weekends – children/young people need to be accompanied by a parent/carer but we have a team of staff and volunteers on hand to provide support and assistance



- Short Breaks activities for children / young people aged 8 to 25 who have High Functioning Autism / Asperger's Syndrome
- Special events including sensory sensitive fireworks displays and Christmas parties
- Group sessions / days for SEND support groups, schools and groups of families



Registration is mandatory for all services and advance booking is usually required. Fees / charges for families are all voluntary but contributions from our service users are an important source of income so we do have suggested contribution levels. We offer children with additional needs a matched volunteer buddy who goes along with them once a week to an activity of their choice such as swimming lessons, gymnastics, uniform groups, sports clubs or drama. Cost of the activity is covered by parents/carers but support from a volunteer is currently free of charge to families.

We get to know each child and match them with a volunteer based on availability, activity location, personality, needs, experience and other factors. Once you have an activity set up or are waiting for a place you can register with us.

Please note we cannot support at groups which are set up specifically for additional needs. Activities must be mainstream sessions running Monday – Friday.

Volunteer 'MakeAbility' engineers design & build free equipment & gadgets for people with a disability or special need

Jake takes a step up



Meet Jake. He's just turned six and has a very rare condition known as RERE Syndrome, a difficult-to-diagnose genetic condition currently identified as affecting less than 30 people around the world.

Jake's low muscle tone means he can crawl but not yet walk. Now that he's a big lad - in age 10 clothes and weighing in at 30kg. - mum and dad were finding it a real problem to help him in and out of the bath. But things have just got a little easier for Jake and his parents as a volunteer 'MakeAbility' engineer from the charity Remap has designed and made him a bespoke set of specially-padded bathroom steps.

Said mum Rachel Green: "Jake cannot get in or out of the bath himself, but he is too mobile to qualify for a hoist. It was fine when he was smaller, but as he grew it became so difficult for us to lift him over the bath-side. Now that he has the steps he is able to get himself both in and out of the bath. They have made a real difference".



Jake's unique steps were built by Remap Berkshire's Phil Cartwright, who lives in **Wokingham**. He is a retired technical sales person who inherited an enthusiasm for practical projects from his father.

Phil joined the Remap Berkshire panel in 2019, alongside 25 like-minded volunteers who enjoy using their skills to create custom-made equipment and gadgets for people in the county who have disabilities or special needs and who cannot find anything suitable to buy. **This 'MakeAbility' service is entirely free**. Panel members have a wide variety of expertise between them, ranging from IT and electronics, to metalwork, carpentry and 3D-printing - the list is endless.

Opportunity, Choice and Wellbeing



Thrive is the leading charity in the UK that uses gardening to bring about positive changes in the lives of people who are living with disabilities or ill health, or are isolated, disadvantaged, or vulnerable.

At our gardens near Reading, we support and work with a wide range of people aged 18+... people who have a physical or learning disability; people with mental health support needs; people who may have sensory loss or autism.

Thrive uses an approach called Social and Therapeutic Horticulture (STH), where trained horticultural therapists work with plants and people to improve an individual's physical and psychological health, communication and thinking skills.

Our horticultural therapists use the garden as a safe and secure environment in which to develop a person's ability to socialise, make friends and gain practical skills that make them more independent. The horticultural therapist will focus on each individual that comes to Thrive, building a set of activities aimed at improving their health needs to achieve goals identified by the client gardener, their family, carer or support worker.

The aim of the ASSIST service is to work in a proactive, supportive, and preventative way with families and providers so that autistic children and young people living in the Wokingham Borough can be the best they can be.

The approach to intervention is holistic and directed by the needs of the individual and those around him or her. The service provides information, support, and training, especially supporting families pre- and post-diagnosis. The ASSIST team are licenced National Autistic Society EarlyBird, EarlyBird Plus and Teen Life parent programme trainers. We also deliver a variety of autism specific workshops plus groups and other opportunities to meet up and network.

Parent programmes and drop-in sessions are available to parents whose child or young person is on the pathway for an autism assessment, and workshops are available to anyone who has an interest in autism, or who feel that the strategies shared might be useful – no referral required!

We also offer focused family support for those living with, caring for or working with a child/young person diagnosed with autism, up to their 18th birthday, who live in the Wokingham Borough via referral.





WBC Children with Disabilities Team (Social Care)

The Children with Disabilities (CWD) Team consists of Social Workers, Occupational Therapists, and support staff.

They provide services for disabled children up to 18 years-old and work together with children, young people, families, carers, and other agencies. In relation to transition they work with adult services in relation to the child's future plan and needs as required.

To be eligible for CWD services, children must:

- Be under 18 years old.
- Be ordinarily resident in the Wokingham Borough.
- Have a severe or profound disability that is having a substantial and long-term negative effect on daily functioning.

WBC Special Educational Needs (SEND) Service

The Special Educational Needs (SEN) Service undertakes the Education Health and Care (EHC) needs assessment for children and young people between the ages of 0 - 25 years. It arranges the provision required to meet the needs identified in an EHC plan and is involved in organising the appropriate annual reviews of a child's progress. The annual review is the statutory process of looking at the needs and provision specified in an EHC Plan and deciding whether these need to change and must be held within 12 months of the EHC plan being finalised. Subsequent reviews must be held within 12 months of the previous review.

The Senior Case Officers/Case Officers will ensure that the EHCP assessment take place in a timely fashion and within statutory timescales and are responsible for managing the assessment itself. This means that they will liaise with parents, young people, and professionals, conduct the coproduction or planning meeting and draw up the plan. They will also be involved in the EHCP Annual Review process which may result in EHCPs remaining unchanged, being amended, or stopping.

We are a healthcare service that provides assessments for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder for children and young people aged from 6 years to 18 years and treatment for children who have been diagnosed by the NHS or in the private sector

The treatment we offer for ADHD is medication

What do we do?

We provide an assessment service for children up to the age of 18 where there is a concern that a child/young person may have autism.

What will an autism assessment usually involve?

The assessment involves gathering information from parents/carers, school (if attending) and also through spending time with the child. The appointments may be in person or online. Whether or not an autism diagnosis is made, a report will be provided including information about further sources of support and recommendations for the child.
