We hoped that through 2021 things would start to return to normal, but again it was a very disrupted year, and we know that it was very stressful for many families.

We continue to have regular contact with the Local Authority, Education, Social Care and Health teams during these difficult times and talk to them about the issues that families are raising.

Although we were not able to run many of our regular events and training in person, we continued to build on our virtual events.

Highlights of our work last year:

- Continued to build our membership and have increase the number of families we contact by 30%
- We now have contact with over 1200+ families through email, social media, and contacts with other local voluntary groups. Thank you to each and every single one of you for all your comments and feedback.
- Continue to offer Max Cards to all our members. If yours has expired, please get in touch.
- Ran more than 26 events for parent carers including 17 training sessions, drop-ins on SENDIASS, the SEND Innovation & Improvement Programme, Phase Transfers and Short Breaks, 62 % more events last
- Ran surveys on SEND Sufficiency in the Borough, Short Breaks and the SENDIASS service.
- Produced an updated Local Offer Booklet 2022 (instead of our live event) which was sent out to over 1200+ families, all pre-schools, primary and secondary schools in the Borough.
- Represented families at the SEND Innovation & Improvement Board (SIIP) and the 5-work stream, including the Accelerated Action plan for Transition to Adulthood.
- Kept our website and social media updated with the information for families.

Due to family and work commitments Helen Corbett was unable to re-join the committee and Kathy Rzysko resigned – thank you both for all your hard work and contributions to our work.

We are encouraged that parent are now starting to see an impact of some of the issues that we have highlighted and worked with education, health, and social care on. These include:

- 85 % of EHCP assessments being completed in 20
- Staffing of the SEND team increased to 18 (11 of these permanent positions).
- Transport process reviewed and new process implemented with monthly panel (which includes a parent rep) to approve requests.
- Ordinarily Available (what all schools should make available to all children in mainstream settings) updated and rolled out.
- Preparing for Adulthood parents' guide produced.
- SEND IIP updates for parents with the WBC Director of Children's Services.

We know there is still lots more to do and will continue to ensure that your voice is represented wherever we can.

If you are interested in joining our team, please do get in touch.

Although we are a small group of volunteers, we all believe in our children and their potential and know with the right provision they can achieve so much. We are passionate about improving services and experiences of our families, but we can only do this with your help. Please continue letting us know about your experiences, what is going well and where things can be improved.

Last but by no means least, I would like to thank the whole committee for all their efforts during yet another difficult year, you are an amazing team.

Local Area Re-visit Inspection of SEND Services April 2021



The results of the Ofsted/CQC revisit were received in late June 21. The revisit report stated "The area has made sufficient progress in addressing five of the six significant weaknesses identified at the initial inspection. The area has not made sufficient progress in addressing one significant weakness". The area still requiring improvement was the "underdeveloped pathway to enable young people with SEND to make a successful transition to adulthood"

As a result, the Local Area was required to produce an Accelerated Action Plan (AAP) to address this. The Local Area will be inspected again in July 22 to ensure that this plan has been met. We will be



collecting information in our Annual SEND Survey (see later), to share with Ofsted & the CQC to tell them about the lived experience for families on this as well as all other areas of SEND provision locally.

We have been very involved in the APP to address the improvements required around transition to adulthood and played a key role in pulling together the new Preparing for Adulthood information guide for Parents and Carers. A copy is on our website here: <u>PfA Guide</u>. Thank you to all the families who helped with this document.

We have continued to be actively involved with the SEND Improvement & Innovation work (which carried on the work initiated on the other 5 areas identified in the original Ofsted Written Statement of Action). The 5 work streams involved over 450 hours work – maintaining the increase in hours we saw in 20/21 with the WSOA.

Events for Parent Carers

Although there were still restrictions on face-to-face events, we were able, with 26 events for Parent Carers including 17 training/workshop sessions, (EHCP Process, Annual Reviews, SEN Support in Schools, Effective Communications and Preparing for Adulthood), 4 drop-ins (SENDIAS, Phase Transfers, Transport, SEND IIP update, Short Breaks) and 2 focus groups (SEND Sufficiency in the Borough).



Sadly, for the second year, we were not able to run our annual Local Offer Live Family Information Day, which we run in partnership with the Wokingham Borough Council CAN (Children with Additional Needs) Network. However, with funding from the Pears Foundation, we were pleased to be able to produce an updated Local Offer Guide. Although not exhaustive, it gives information about some of the organisations and services locally that can provide activities, help, information and support to you and your child aged 0-25 years with any Special Educational Need or Disability.

Launch of our Annual SEND 2022

We are launching an annual SEND survey to get a complete understanding of the SEND services for families in the Borough and the impact that the SEND Innovation & Improvement work is having on families lived experience.

The survey will run until the 30th June and is for all families who live in the Wokingham Borough and who have a child with any additional needs or disabilities to understand where services are working and where improvements still need to be made. We will use the answers to prioritise our work to make sure they are the areas that are most important to you.

Surveys last year.....thank you for your feedback

A BIG thank you to all the parent carers who have completed surveys or consultations for us during 2021/22. We

know there have been a lot but without your feedback on these, we cannot tell Education, Health and Social Care what is working and what needs improving. The results of the surveys you completed last year have resulted in the following changes:

SEND Sufficiency in the Borough - The Oaks new special school is due to open September 2023. The Resource Base / SEND Unit review is now complete. WBC are in consultation with schools around the proposals before presenting to the WBC Leadership Team for sign off.



Short Breaks for those with Direct Payments (DPs) & Short Breaks for those without DP's – this information has been shared with WBC Social Care and the commissioning team; they are currently waiting for more commissioning resource to progress this work.

SENDIASS service – Various recommendations from the survey are being progressed by SENDIASS to improve their service.

Please keep completing the surveys and consultations. The information they provide is so important and makes a real difference to improving services in the borough.
